## About

## The Survey

This Survey Report presents findings of a PSRPanel survey about evidence-based management (EBM) in the public and nonprofit sectors.

The survey was conducted in January to February 2016, and included online responses from 122 panelists.

Some tables presented in the results may not add to $100 \%$ because of rounding.

## The Panel

The Public Service Research PaneI, PSRPanel, is an online community of public service professionals who sign up to participate in occasional webbased surveys and studies about the important work they do and the organizations they help lead.

It is important to point out that the panel is not a random sample, and thus the results are not scientifically projectable to a larger population.
