



About

The Survey

How do opinions about President Donald Trump differ between public service professionals and the general public? This PSRPanel survey addresses this question by using a set of questions identical to those asked in a similar study conducted by Pew Research Center for the People & the Press in April 2017. The PSR panelists' opinions are compared to that of 1501 national adults interviewed by telephone.

The PSRPanel survey was conducted From July to from late July to early August in 2017. A total of 131 responses from PSR panelists were collected.

The Panel

The Public Service Research Panel, *PSRPanel*, is an online community of public service professionals who sign up to participate in occasional webbased surveys and studies about the important work they do and the organizations they help lead.

It is important to point out that the panel is not a random sample, and thus the results are not scientifically projectable to a larger population.





3. Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling his job as President?




4. In making important decisions, do you think Donald Trump is too impulsive, too cautious, or about right?






5. Please tell us whether you are very confident, somewhat confident, not too confident, or not at all confident that Trump can handle an international crisis?




6. Please tell us whether you are very confident, somewhat confident, not too confident, or not at all confident that Trump can manage the Executive Branch effectively?






7. Please tell us whether you are very confident, somewhat confident, not too confident, or not at all confident that Trump can work effectively with Congress?




8. Please tell us whether you are very confident, somewhat confident, not too confident, or not at all confident that Trump can prevent major scandals in his administration?






9. Please tell us whether you are very confident, somewhat confident, not too confident, or not at all confident that Trump can use military force wisely?
